Crouch Vale from South Woodham Ferrers, who brew their own selection of cask ale – notably the award winning Brewer’s Gold, supply us with a vast range of guest ales from small local and national breweries. Adnams, provide us with their Broadside, Aspoll Cyder and Meantime Stout and Lager. We have four pumps of which two change weekly, even daily sometimes.

Full Time Ale



Adnams Broadside (4.7% ABV) Reddish brown with a dense and beautiful head. Bitter berry-like aroma and explosive flavours of nuts, chocolate, caramel, toffee, black currants and cherries. Nice bitter ending, overall a lovely strong ale.



Brewer’s Gold, Crouch Vale (4.0% ABV) Supreme Champion Beer of Britain at the Great British Beer Festival 2005 AND 2006, this is a pale, refreshing and hoppy beer with gorgeous aromas of tropical fruits.

Cyder



Aspoll Suffolk Cyder (5.5% ABV) Apples used include varieties such as Kingston Black, Medaille d’or, Cox, Bramley, Yarlinton Mill, Tremlett’s Bitter, Blenheim Orange, Chiver’s Delight, Tom Putt. An earthy, country style cider with great charm and wine-like appeal. Totally refreshing

Stout



London Stout, Meantime Brewery, Greenwich (4.5% ABV) is derived from the original Stout Porters of the early 19th Century. Made without the roast barley used in their Irish descendents, dark malts and London water work together to give a beer of great complexity. Soft mocha coffee and vanilla notes on the nose hint at the lingering vanilla notes on the tongue. A velvet mouthfeel holds a rich and complex palate of caramel, molasses and nut roast, which gives way to a gentle malt bitter dryness.

Lager

Kaltenberg Hell (4.1% ABV) Brewed under licence by Thwaites in Lancashire. Derived from the Herman Helles, meaning bright in colour, it is brewed to the German Purity Law. It is a crisp, refreshing, smooth lager with no aftertaste.



Calvors, Premium Suffolk Lager (5% ABV). One of the few lagers brewed in the UK, the only one brewed in Suffolk. Alec Williamson brews from his family’s farm near Coddendam, Ipswich. After fermenting, it is stored and conditioned for a number of weeks before being triple cold filtered. It uses locally grown malted barley. It is clean, refined, hoppy, a really polished beer ideal as a thirst quencher or with food.
