Based in Suffolk at Whites Fruit Farm in Ashbocking about 8 miles north of Ipswich. Organic juices are made from fruit grown without artificial fertilizers or pesticides, and are all certified by the Soil Association. Each one tastes so good because freshly pressed apple and pear juice is used rather than concentrates, and they are left unfiltered to distinguish them from the Classics range. The Classic apple juices are freshly pressed at White's Fruit Farm in Ashbocking, Suffolk. Borrowing filtration techniques from wine producers, the juices are clear filtered and bottled immediately to capture the fresh flavour and aroma of the apples. They are free from any preservatives or colourings. The apples we have chosen are prime examples of English fruit at its best.
